Working with my children	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Talk to my children more and be more open. - Talk to my children about what sites they go on. - Talk to her more about what she does. - Listen and understand what they are doing and why. - Use the tablet/laptop with my children to check what they are doing. - Not be so against social networking when the time comes, instead be involved to ensure they do it safely.
Resources	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Looking at all the resources and deciding which ones would be best at his age. - Check what she is using via the NSPCC website. - Look at the websites/resources suggested (x3). - Look at the school's online safety website section (x2). - Look at the resources to get more privacy. - Looking at all the safety information and how to find it on sites. - Watch the internet safety videos and look at the videos aimed at children. - Finding what programmes are safe to use.
Monitoring/Security Settings	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Set up/review parental control settings (x10) - Be aware of Facebook permissions. - Look at the resources to get more privacy. - Check settings regularly. - As she gets older, putting filters etc. onto apps she would access. - Check all the settings on mobile technology. - Checking what information I'm allowing whilst down loading apps.
General Online Safety	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Looking at all the safety information and how to find it on sites. - Think about how to introduce them to online content safely.
