PE




On PE days children are able to come into school wearing their PE kit

This term's homework has been set by the Humanities team.



The theme is 'Respect towards others.'

The theme is showing respect to others.

Respect means being kind and fair to others. Can you show how respect is shown; around the world, in history or in religion.

- You could share information about a respectful person from history, with a presentation, PowerPoint or drawing.
- You can use your map skills and demonstrate how countries show respect to each other with examples or how people show respect to the world around them.
- You could retell a story from a religion that demonstrates respect towards others.



Respect helps people live peacefully, understand each other, and make good choices.

Homework is due on Monday 20th October all children who hand in on time (to their class teacher) will be given a certificate and the most creative and innovative will be shared on the website.

Homework club for term 1 with Mrs Jacques will be during Wednesday lunchtime in the Key Stage 2 library.



Important Things

Phonics and spelling homework will be sent via message on class Dojo. These words will be tested weekly (your class teachers will let you know test days). Weekly maths homework, posted on Dojo class news, will focus place value and calculation. Additionally, class teachers will post 'How to' videos for new maths units for you to practice at home.

Lastly, all children are expected to read for pleasure daily. This can be shared reading or independent but listening and asking questions is paramount to creating reading confidence. Please record in reading records. Reading books and records are expected to be in school every day.
